

Sent To Save

1. Christ was sent to save the world

1. Christ was sent to save all people (Matthew 1:21 and 1 John 4:14).
2. The one they refused was sent to be their deliverer (Isaiah 53:4).
3. He came to preach a saving message and had others preach for Him as well (Mark 16:15).

2. Moses helped set free the slaves

1. Israel had to believe Moses (Exodus 4:31).
2. Israel turned from serving Pharaoh to follow Moses (Psalm 106:10).
3. Moses led Israel through the sea from the sinful land to the promised land
 1. Hebrews 11:29
 2. 1 Corinthians 10:2
 3. Psalm 106:11).

3. Jesus set men free from serving sin

1. Like Moses men must believe Jesus (John 8:24).
2. The Israelites turned from serving Pharaoh and followed Moses, we must turn from serving sin and follow Christ (Acts 17:30).
3. We need to go through the water like the Israelites where the sinner dies and the free man goes through. We leave the sinful land and head for the promised land.

Sought For Slaughter

1. The problem in Egypt

1. A Pharaoh who did not know Joseph (Exodus 1:8).
2. Pharaoh was afraid that the children of Israel would join one of their enemies (Exodus 1:10).
3. He commanded the midwives to kill all the male children born by the Hebrew women, but the midwives refused (Exodus 1:16-17).
4. Pharaoh still commanded the death of the children (Exodus 1:22).

2. Moses is hidden and delivered

1. Moses' parents hid him three months (Exodus 2:2).
2. Moses was found by the daughter of Pharaoh and was raised as his grandson (Exodus 2:5-10).
3. Moses' faithful mother must have had a huge impact on his later life (Hebrews 11:24-25).

3. The problem in Bethlehem

1. In the days of Herod, wise men came (Matthew 2:2).
2. Herod sought to learn the location of Christ's birth (Matthew 2:4).
3. Herod killed all the children that were in Bethlehem from 2 years old and under in hopes of killing the Christ (Matthew 2:14).

4. Christ is delivered

1. The angel warns Joseph to flee (Matthew 2:13).
2. Joseph leads his family to safety (Matthew 2:14).

Separated From Splendor

1. Moses forsook the riches of Egypt to save Israel

1. Moses had lived 40 years in Egypt as the son of Pharaoh's daughter.
2. He enjoyed position, riches, education (Acts 7:22).
3. There came a point in Moses' life where he no longer wanted to live in glory.
 1. He wanted to save and suffer with his brethren (Acts 7:23).
 2. He refused to be called Pharaoh's daughter (Hebrews 11:24).
 3. He wanted to suffer instead with his people (Hebrews 11:25-26).
 4. Moses feared God more than Pharaoh and men (Hebrews 11:27).

2. Christ forsook riches to save us

1. He was rich but became poor for us (2 Corinthians 8:9).
2. Jesus emptied Himself of the pleasures of heaven and the form of God to come and die for us (Philippians 2:5-8).

Sent To Save

1. Moses was sent to save his people (Exodus 3)

1. God sent Moses to bring Israel out of Egypt (Exodus 3:10).
2. The one they refused was sent to deliver (Acts 7:35).
3. He came to preach a saving message and had Aaron as his spokesperson (Exodus 3:16-17 and Exodus 4:15-16).
4. Moses and Aaron performed signs to back up their claims, rod to snake and leper's hand (Exodus 4:30).
