Unlawful Subtraction

1. Observing the Feast of Booths

- 1. The people ask for the book of the law that it may be read (Nehemiah 8:1).
- 2. They found that they needed to dwell in booths in the seventh month (Nehemiah 8:13-14).
 - 1. It just so happened to be the seventh month when they were reading this (8:2).
 - 2. They were reading Leviticus 23:39-44.
- 3. These followed the words, gathering the branches and building the booths (Nehemiah 8:15-16).
- 4. They had not done this since the days of Joshua (Nehemiah 8:17).
 - 1. Nobody had a grandparent or great grandparent that took them in the seventh month to build the booths.
 - They had not kept this part of God's law for about 1,000 years.
- 5. How did they restore the practice that God commanded which had been neglected for a thousand years? They went back to the commandment in the Bible and practiced it.

2. God's word stands true

- 1. **Isaiah 40:8** "The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever."
- 2. Jeremiah 6:16 "Thus says the LORD: "Stand by the roads, and look, and ask for the ancient paths, where the good way is; and walk in it, and find rest for your souls. But they said, 'We will not walk in it."
- 3. We can always go back to the word of God and see what God desires from us.
- 4. We must go back to the source of the fountain to drink the pure water, not the water influenced by man.

Nadab And Abihu

- 1. Nadab and Abihu offered God fire that was not authorized
 - 1. Leviticus 10:1
 - 2. Maybe it was special fire or maybe they had a talent for building fire.
- 2. How were they rewarded for their deed?
 - 1. Leviticus 10:2
 - "But God they were giving you something from the heart!"
- 3. Were there words of God that could have avoided their deaths?
 - 1. They were not to offer strange intense (Exodus 30:8-9).
 - 2. There was a specific place the priests were to get the goals (Leviticus 16:12).

4. What do my actions tell God when I don't give him what he asks for?

- 1. Leviticus 10:3
- 2. Those that come before God must treat him as Holy (Set apart), and he must be glorified (to be heavy, valuable, praiseworthy).
- 3. When do I not bring God what he wants I am treating Him as a common god with no value.
- 5. They were the right boys in the right place with the right censers and incense but they had the wrong fire.

Uzzah And The Ark

- 1. The ark of the covenant had been in the hands of the Philistines and now it is in the hands of the Israelites.
- 2. They did a very commendable action putting the ark of God on a new cart (1 Chronicles 13:7).
 - 1. 1 Chronicles 13:9.
 - 2. Numbers 4:15.
 - 3. 1 Chronicles 13:10.
- 3. I thought that Uzzah was just trying to help why would God strike him down?
- 4. God's words could have prevented Uzzah's death
 - 1. Numbers 4:15.
 - 2. The blueprint for transporting the ark.
 - 1. Exodus 25:9-14.
 - 2. Deuteronomy 10:8
 - 3. The cars and who they belonged to (Numbers 7:3-9).
 - 4. They had inspiration as to how to transport the ark.

5. David was displeased with God but has a change of heart

- 1. 1 Chronicles 13:11-12.
- 2. David must have consulted the word of God.
 - 1. None should carry the ark but levites (15:2).
 - 2. He told the sons of Kohath that they were to bring up the ark (15:12).
 - 3. David admits they did not follow the ancient order of things (15:13).
 - 4. Followed the commandments (15:15).
 - 5. They did what God's works said to do and restored the practice to the way it belonged.
 - 6. What Moses wrote centuries before still applied to David and the people of his day.
