- 5. Esau is profane (Hebrews 12:16).
- 6. If my mind is carnal I will fail like Esau (1 John 2:15-16).
- 7. If my mind is carnal I will forget about the value of my soul (Matthew 16:26).

#### 2. The carelessness of Esau

- 1. Sold his birthright.
  - 1. Genesis 25:33
  - 2. While yes he was deceived, it was still the actions of Esau that caused his failure.
- 2. Satisfied his hunger.
  - 1. Genesis 25:34.
  - 2. Imagine the decision of giving away your inheritance for a bowl of chili.
- 3. Sought inheritance in sadness
  - 1. Hebrews 12:17
  - 2. Like sin that soup gave unto Esau no lasting satisfaction.
  - 3. He had to live with the sorry of losing everything.

#### 3. Put to work

- 1. If you choose sin you are willingly selling the most important thing in your life (your soul).
- 2. You may get temporary satisfaction but will hunger again.
- 3. Sin not only provides only temporary satisfaction but also long lasting consequences and struggles.

## 3. Jacob took opportunity of Esau's weakness

- 1. Jacob was a deceiver and his name indicated such.

  - 2. Genesis 25:26
- 2. Jacob was there cooking a pot of bean soup.
  - 1. Genesis 25:29
  - 2. The soup wasn't worth much but cost a lot.
